

Activity sheet A star, a wish and a wonder

Don't worry if you can't print this activity sheet. Just use a paper and pen instead. You could even present it as a poster with pictures.

It's great to have your own opinions about books. Now you have chosen a book, use this sheet to explain what you think about it.

For example:

- You could give your book a **star** for the choice of the interesting character (e.g. Freddie the Footballer), or the setting (e.g. a magical land).
- You could **wish** for something to happen in your book, or for it to be different in some way (e.g. I wish there could have been a more exciting opener).
- You could wonder about what will happen to the character at the end of the book (e.g. will Freddie become a professional footballer?)

Extra challenges

Once you have read your book, can you do some or all of these challenges?

1. Write a book review

Think about:

- What are the good and bad parts of the book?
- Is there anything you would change?
- Would you recommend your book to your friends when you see them again? Why?

2. Write a letter to a character in your book.

Think about:

- What would you like to ask or say to the character?
- Would you like to tell them anything about your life?

3. Create a poster to encourage other people to read the book.

Think about:

- What is the book about?
- Why do you think other people would like it?
- Which people would like it the most (i.e. football fans age 9-10)?
- Can you draw a picture of the characters?
