

Top tips for writing your report

- Be as clear and concise as possible.
- Always be accurate with the key informationmatch score, scorers etc.
- Decide what the key elements are that you need to include in the report.
- Try to express yourself and tell the story in your "voice".
- Use language that will interest and engage the reader.



- Think of a headline that will draw the reader into the report
- Write quickly so that you don't miss any of the action!
