For this week's challenge we would like you to imagine you are a team captain for the day and write a short motivational team talk to inspire your players.


You could be the captain of your favourite football team, your school team or it could even be an imaginary team - the choice is yours!

Team captains have an important role to play in looking out for others on the team. A strong team is one where all team players work together regardless of their differences. When there are disagreements within a team or when the team isn't performing very well, it is the responsibility of the team captain to be encouraging, diffuse any differences between players and to celebrate them instead. The team captain is responsible for boosting morale and one of the ways in which they do this is by giving motivational team talks.

Pre-match team talk

Managers and captains give team talks before a game and at half time. They can make the difference between a team winning and losing a game and they can help to create a positive team spirit. Here are some examples of how different people approach them.

Pep Guardiola, Manager of Manchester City FC, encourages his players to be friends as he believes that this will make his team be the best it can be. He also knows how important it is to speak from the heart.



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Sir Alex Ferguson, former Manchester United FC Manager,

delivered many motivational speeches during his 26 years at Manchester United. He put trust in his players and always put energy into his team talks. He often focused on the need for each player to work hard and achieve.

Tips:

- The opening line of your team talk is crucial you want to captivate your audience. You can do this by asking a question or making a statement.
- Think about your **audience** what will they respond to best? Remember that everyone is different and what motivates one person may not work for another. Try different ways to make sure you encourage the whole team.
- Use **repetition** to reinforce your message.
- Include **short calls to action**, e.g. 'Do it now!' 'Let's go!'
- Be **direct** in your team talk, keeping it **short** and **concise**.
- Keep it **positive** and **uplifting** remind the team of times when they've performed well together or how hard they've trained!
